Re: Weekly Update



Police Department (JPD)

This week, Staff completed their bloodborne pathogens training, which is required annually. We also finalized the agreements with the Slinger Speedway and the Slinger Police Department to assist with staffing at several events this summer, as we've done in the past.

On Saturday evening at 9:18 PM, an officer stopped a vehicle for suspended registration. The driver, a 42-year-old Milwaukee man, had a suspended driver license and the odor of marijuana was present. During a search of the vehicle, the officer located crack cocaine, marijuana, prescription medications, and a loaded firearm. The man was taken into custody and charged with felon in possession of a firearm, possession of cocaine (2nd offense), possession of a narcotic without a prescription, possession of THC (2nd offense), and possession of drug paraphernalia.

On Tuesday morning at 4:46 AM, a domestic disturbance was reported and an adult male fled the residence. The suspect, a 36-year-old Jackson man, was located a short time later in his vehicle at the Park and Ride. The man had been drinking and appeared to be under the influence. He refused a blood draw and a search warrant was obtained for his blood. Charges of operating while under the influence (4th offense) were sent to the District Attorney's Office.

Fire Department (JFD)

This week, JFD responded to 17 medical calls and zero (0) fire calls. The last time JFD went seven (7) days without a fire call was in June of 2021, an increasingly rare occurrence.

Monday night training included a class presented by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources titled "Structural Protection for Wisconsin Fire Departments." The course focused on protecting structures during wildland fire incidents.

Tuesday night, our CPR instructors renewed their certifications to teach CPR classes, which is required by the American Heart Association every two (2) years. Over these last two (2) years, JFD taught 15 CPR classes. This number is about half of the typical number of classes we teach, which is due to COVID-19 safety restrictions.

Thursday morning, we provided a fire station tour for a group from Golden Pearl Adult Day Services.

Lastly, the weather siren at the intersection of State Highway 60 and County Road P was reported out of service. American Signal was called out to investigate and found a blown fuse, along with a bad door switch. Repairs were completed and both Village weather sirens are functioning properly.

Parks and Recreation

The Senior Winter Meals Cooking Class, "Teaching and Sharing Recipes for One", was a big hit and the class was full. The next session will be in April. Register early, as the available spots fill quickly.

On Thursday, the Jackson Community Center (JCC) hosted the Village Trustee Candidate Forum, presented by the Greater Jackson Business Alliance (GJBA). Rough inspections were completed this week on the latest 4-unit condominium building under construction in the Stonewall Ridge subdivision. Rough inspections were completed on two (2) homes in the Laurel Springs Addition No. 1 subdivision and on another home in the Cobblestone Meadows subdivision. Pre-cast concrete wall installation has been completed for the new HDI Wholesale building on Caymus Court. Exterior sewer, water, and stormwater utilities are now being installed. Early start and erosion control permits were picked up this week, along with the permit for outside utility work for the pre-school addition at Morning Star Lutheran School.
