Re: Weekly Update



Police Department

This week Staff worked with Motorola and Village contracted IT provider, Pros4Technology, to install the server for the in-squad cameras. When this work is complete, the squad videos will automatically and wirelessly upload to the in-house server when the squad cars are driven into the squad garage. By automizing this process, it will reduce the amount of Staff time previously dedicated to manually downloading and uploading all squad videos.

A single vehicle crash was reported in the Morning Meadows subdivision on Tiger Lily Drive on Friday morning at 7:30 AM. The driver, a 52-year-old Cedarburg woman, fled the scene prior to the officer's arrival. Several citations were issued, and alcohol is believed to be a factor in the crash. On Saturday evening, Officer DeMaa responded to call for mutual aid to an address in the Town of Jackson for a report of a drug overdose. Officer DeMaa administered Narcan, an opiate antidote, to the victim. Jackson Fire Department responded and transported the victim to a hospital.

On Sunday morning at 11:12 AM, Officer Krueger responded to a report of a disorderly male subject in Green Valley. The suspect, a 32-year-old Jackson man, had been drinking in violation of the terms of his probation. Prior to the officer arriving, he fled the scene but was located in a neighbor's shed. The man was uncooperative and resistive with Officer Krueger and a Slinger officer that responded. A taser was deployed to take the man into custody. He was transported to the Washington County Jail and charges were filed for resisting/ obstructing and for the probation violation.

Fire Department

This week, JFD responded to 13 medical calls and six (6) fire calls. The fire calls included the following incidents: a fire alarm at the fair park, a grass fire on Lusan Drive, a non-permitted burn, a mutual aid call to Germantown for fire at Waste Management, a search for a hunter that fell out of a tree stand and sustained injuries, and a mutual aid call to Newberg for a grass fire.

Monday night training included Life Net presenting EMS training on the topic of caring for a trauma patient. Key lessons for patient survival included treatment for Hypothermia, Coagulopathy, and Metabolic Acidosis.

JFD would like to share a few simple Holiday reminders to keep you and your loved ones safe. Thanksgiving meal prep often includes cooking turkeys which must be completely defrosted, and if placed in a deep fryer, it must be cooked outside of any home, garage, or enclosed structure. Generally speaking, there are more house fires caused from incidents involving cooking, heating, and overloading electrical outlets. If a fire does start, you are reminded to first remove the heat source and cover it.

Parks and Recreation

The Jackson Community Center will be closed Thursday and Friday to observe the Thanksgiving Holiday. Saturday JCC will be open for Basketball Open Gym from 8AM-Noon. Sunday JCC will be open for Kettlebrook Church services. As a reminder, school will not be in session on Monday for the West Bend School District. All Boys & Girls Club members are welcome to attend Boys & Girls Club in West Bend on this day.

Wednesday the Jackson Parks and Recreation Department hosted a blood drive with the American Red Cross. Thanks to all that helped advertise and donate!

Building Inspection

Foundation work has concluded on the Genoa Healthcare development. Foundation work for HDI Wholesale is anticipated to be completed next week. Both projects, located on Caymus Court, will now move into the underground utility and interior plumbing phase. Construction has begun on yet another home in the Laurel Springs Addition No. 1 Subdivision. Inspection volume continues to be relatively high despite the holiday week.

Public Works

The Street and Parks Department Crew continues curbside bag pickup and brush chipping. The Yard Waste Dropoff Site is scheduled to close on December 1st, which will rely upon the weather and leaf collection. The site could remain open until collection is completed beyond this anticipated closure date. Those intested can call the Public Works Staff at (262) 677-0707 for daily updated information. Lastly, the Coffee Connection Trail Project has concrete work and landscaping finishing up in the next week.

Administration

This week, Staff dedicated time to reviewing plans for the Maple Fields Subdivision, which is a proposed 100 single family home development to be constructed south of the Sherman Road and east of Maple Road and Mill Road in the Village of Jackson. The Plan Commission and Village Board will review the application for Preliminary Plat Approvals at the scheduled December meetings.
