Re: Weekly Update



Police Department

On Tuesday at 7:55 AM, officers responded to a report of a vehicle that had been stolen from a gas station on Main Street near Glen Brooke Drive. The owner of the vehicle had left his keys in his vehicle when he went into the store. Officer Krueger responded and provided other local police agencies of a description of the vehicle. A Washington County Sheriff's deputy located the vehicle on I-41 southbound near Holy Hill Road. The vehicle failed to stop for the deputy and a high-speed pursuit ensued. The driver exited I-41 at County Line Road traveling at a high rate of speed, crashing the stolen vehicle into a vehicle that was stopped at a stop light. He then crashed into another vehicle that was passing through the intersection, which subsequently rolled over. The vehicle became disabled, and the suspect fled on foot. The 32-year-old Milwaukee man was apprehended by Germantown Police and eventually turned over to the custody of the Washington County Jail.

Officer Trevarthen completed his bi-annual sex offender registry checks this week. Officer Trevarthen is assigned to make contact with each of the registered sex offenders that live in the Village to ensure they are in compliance with the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry. One offender was found to be living within 1500 feet of a public park and was ordered to establish residency outside of that area. Fire Department

This week, JFD responded to 21 medical calls, 18 inspections, and 11 fire calls. The fire calls consisted of two (2) fire alarms, a grass fire on Pleasant Valley Road, a person stuck in an elevator, smoke inside of a building, a lockout, a water leak, electrical lines down on Georgetown Drive, a motor vehicle versus tree accident, a structure fire in West Bend, and a two (2) vehicle accident with ejection on Pleasant Valley Road and Hwy 45.

Monday night training was an officer meeting. Also, the annual ladder testing was completed on all fire apparatus by Great Lakes Ladder Testing. No issues were found and all equipment passed!

Parks and Recreation

Public Works

The Jackson Water Utility performed work on a fire hydrant located on Jackson Drive, which is used regularly by Jackson Fire Department. A check valve has been installed on the fire hydrant to prevent a future water main break.

The Street and Parks Department Crew performed work on the Jackson Park ballfield, to allow games to continue Wednesday night. This week, cold patching and crack filling was completed on a number of streets within the Village; a sweep of the streets has been scheduled to clean up any remaining debris from the completed work. Repairs continue on the Village Hall generator.

At the Wastewater Treatment Plant, daily operations continue to include shop cleaning and maintenance. The crew conducted sewer jetting on Main Street from County Road P to Eagle Drive, in preparation for the resurfacing project scheduled for 2024. Due to the heavy rain this week, the Wastewater Plant received high flows, but nothing extraordinary. Repairs are scheduled for next week on the SCADA system.

Lastly, the contractor hired to complete mowing, erosion control maintenance, and re-seeding of areas for the Spruce Street and Ridgeway Drive Project continued work this week.

Building Inspection

Permit submittals continue to be steady, nearing 800 applications year-to-date. Plans and permits were submitted this week for the last of 24 homes to be built in the Morning Meadows Subdivision.

Staff has transitioned over the updated State of Wisconsin permit submittal portal. The portal allows Municipalities to report new home construction directly to the state, as required by the Legislature. Staff participated in an online demonstration of a new permit database and submittal program. Staff has been looking at ways to streamline the permit submittal and approval process, while also providing public access to those records.

Clerk

The Village received the 2021 second quarter video service franchise fees. From Charter Communications, the Village received an amount of \$14,429.24. From AT&T, the Village received an amount of \$3,238.15.
