Re: Final Weekly Update of the Year



Police Department

On June 16th, President Trump issued an Executive Order on Safe Policing for Safe Communities. Part of the order states that the US Attorney General (AG) will allocate Department of Justice (DOJ) discretionary grant funding only to those state and local law enforcement agencies that have sought or are in the process of seeking appropriate credentials from a reputable independent credentialing body certified by the AG. The AG's standards for certification require independent credentialing bodies to, at a minimum, confirm that the state or local law enforcement agency's use-of-force policies adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local laws; and the state or local law enforcement agency's use-of-force policies prohibit the use of chokeholds except in those situations where deadly force is allowed by law.

To receive discretionary DOJ grant funding, an agency's use of force policy must comply with the AG's requirements and be certified by an independent credentialing body. Agencies will be required to receive certification by January 31st to be eligible for federal funds in that year's funding cycle. Certification is valid for three years. The Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group (WILEAG) has been approved by the AG's Office as the primary independent credentialing body for Wisconsin. Last week the WILEAG board certified the Jackson Police Department's Use of Force policy for a three-year period.

On December 25th, Officers responded to a Christmas Day domestic disturbance. An adult male was arrested for domestic-related disorderly conduct and transported to the Washington County Jail.

On December 26th, Officers responded to a report of a fight between two adults, one who required medical attention at a local hospital. Charges were referred to the Washington County District Attorney.

This morning, just after midnight, Officers were called to a local business after an employee was found to be under the influence. The suspect had five open criminal cases which required her to maintain absolute sobriety. The adult woman resisted arrest while trying to hide a crack pipe. She was taken into custody and transported to the Washington County Jail. Charges have been requested for possession of drug paraphernalia and five counts of bail jumping.

On Tuesday, we completed an annual audit of our property (evidence) room. Fifty items were randomly selected to be audited. All fifty items were present and in the appropriate place within the property room. Officer Lars Krueger serves as the property room manager. He invested a tremendous amount of time in 2020 instituting a barcode system for the property. The system works with our records management system software and allows for more efficient storage and location of items in the property room. Congratulations to Officer Krueger on a 100% audit.

Fire Department

There have been thirty medical and four fire calls in the last week, including two vehicle fires, a gas odor complaint, and a false alarm.

No training was conducted over the holidays. A new training schedule is being prepared for 2021. Inspections will resume after the first of the year. CPR training sessions are being scheduled.

Please make sure snow is cleared away from the fire hydrant nearest your home. Delays in reaching it during an emergency may be a matter of life or death.

Joint Parks and Recreation

New flooring was installed in the Fitness Center at the Jackson Community Center last week. Thank you to everyone who helped us get this huge project accomplished. We also added two new ellipticals.

Flooring was installed in the Early Childhood Center this week. It will be easier to clean and is a welcome change for the classroom.

Tuesday, we prepared for Wednesday's Snow Emergency. Kim and Angie and the DPW opened the facility and took care of clearing the snow. We made sure Senior Meals got delivered and made sure classes ran safely or would be canceled if necessary.

JACC Holiday Hours: The Jackson Area Community Center will be closed Thursday, December 31st and January 1st – New Year's Day. We will be open Saturday, January 2nd from 8:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. for Fitness Center members, and 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. for Open Gym.

Building Inspection

Permit submittals remain slower due to the holidays and the normal seasonal slowdown.

Inspection volume was busy with several residential, commercial, and industrial projects moving into various phases of finishing. Pre-pour inspections were completed in Building C (Village Administration and Village Boardroom areas) of the new Municipal Complex. Concrete was poured Tuesday morning.

A total of 950 permits were issued in 2020, a twenty-eight percent increase over the 10-year average. 2020 permit fee revenues increased nearly thirty-one percent over the 10-year average.

Public Works

The staff has been involved in snow operations this week in addition to last minute building cleaning.

The Village is executing the contract this week with waste hauler GFL for trash and recycling collection. Please see the following flyer from GFL. It is also being mailed to your home.

NOTE TWO MAJOR CHANGES IN THE TRASH & RECYCLING PROGRAM:

While there was recycling pick-up this week, there will again be recycling pick-up next week (the week of January 3rd), adjusting to a new bi-weekly cycle.) Trash will continue to be picked up every week. Please see the map on the attached flyer for the collection day change in the southeast quadrant of the Village (shaded in yellow.) Trash and recycling pick-up will now be on Thursdays (rather than Wednesdays) for the area south of Main Street (STH 60) and east of Jackson Drive.

Reminder: All dog and cat licenses expire on December 31, 2020. The pet's rabies certificate is required before a license may be issued.

The first day to circulate nomination papers for Village President and Trustee was December 1st. The last day to circulate the papers and remit to the Clerk's Office is Tuesday, January 5, 2021 by 5:00 p.m.

Staff has been busy processing tax payments and pet licenses. Just a reminder that all pet licenses need to be renewed by January 1st; and the first installment (or full amount) of your tax bill is due by January 31st.

Administrator


Jennifer Keller will begin her tenure as Village of Jackson Administrator on Monday, January 4, 2021.

Cart Placement

- The arrows on the lid of the cart must point to the street
- Handles and wheels should face away from the street
- The garbage cart should be placed within 2 ft. of the street on one side of the driveway
- The recycle cart should be placed within 2 ft. of the street on the other side of the driveway
- Please keep 3 ft. of clearance between the carts and other objects, especially mailboxes and vehicles

- Mixed trash
- Bagged garbage/ food waste
- Ceramics
- Styrofoam and other loose trash

Recycling collection is every other week. Please place the following items in your recycle cart:

Mixed Containers

- Aluminum cans and clean aluminum foil
- Tin cans, steel cans, aerosol cans, empty/ dried paint cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- #1-7 plastic
- Milk cartons, juice boxes, soup cartons

Mixed Paper

- Newspaper, magazines, books, mail, school/ office paper
- Brown corrugated cardboard
- Gray chipboard (cereal and shoe boxes)
- Brown paper bags
- Shredded paper (bagged in clear plastic)

DO NOT put the following items in the recycle cart:



- Styrofoam of any kind
- Trash
- Construction material
- Clothing
- Yard waste
- Household hazardous waste
- Electronics

Please do not put recycling in plastic bags (except for shredded paper). Local clean sweep programs may offer alternative options for disposal of fluorescent light bulbs, household hazardous waste, pharmaceuticals, and electronics.


