Subject: Weekly Update



Police Department

The decommissioned squad sold for \$4,500 and was picked up on Wednesday.

The deadline for police chief applications is next Tuesday.

Chiefs Dolnick and Chief Swaney met with Cedar Corp on Thursday regarding the public safety building project.

Fire Department

There were thirty-five medical and nine fire calls for the last two weeks, including three grass fires: on Sleepy Hollow Road, Wildlife Lane, and in the marsh off of Highland Road. The JFD was also called to a working fire near Little Cedar Lake and to Richfield for a house fire. Other calls included a carbon monoxide call, a water break in a residence, a school fire alarm, and a two vehicle accident with injuries.

EMS training was conducted Monday evening; makeup training for any shortage of hours necessary for EMT license renewals. Topics included airway, cardiac, OB, pediatrics, and trauma. Another session included trauma and stroke training with Froedtert Hospital.

The JFD participated in "Donate Life" campaign flag raising ceremony at Saint Joseph Hospital – a state-wide campaign to show how one organ donor can save eight lives. A family in attendance had donated their daughter's organs after a horrible accident. The recipient of their daughter's heart was also present for the ceremony

Joint Parks and Recreation

Youth Dance classes started Wednesday. A new tap class was added for this semester. Children are still able to join; the dance recital will be June 9th at Action in Jackson.

Building Inspection

Permits and inspections remain steady.

The exterior sewer lateral was connected to the main on Emery Way and the sampling manhole was installed and tested at JD Laser.

Public Works

The Jackson Water Utility meter change out program continues. 256 disconnect notices were sent to water and sewer customers; the list for disconnection included 122 customers with a total outstanding balance of \$26,859. Fifty-one delinquent accounts were disconnected; nine remain off and will be turned over to the Inspection Department. Three were in the town of Jackson, thirty-four made payment plans, and thirty-four could not be turned off, because of multiple users on one service line. The Water SCADA System panel and computer have been moved to the new building and are now on line. The Jackson Water Utility hosted the first of many Rural Water Associates seminars at the new building on Thursday, April 5th.

The Street & Parks Department crew continues to work on the new building, plow SNOW, and maintain the trucks. The new building awaits connection to the internet. Once completed the computer server can be installed with the routers to connect with the Village Hall server. The south side accessible entrance construction has begun; roughing-in has been completed. Windows and doors will be installed next. Grading has begun on the south side of the building for the new entrance. The final cleanup of the barn site has been scheduled; remaining wood materials will be removed by dumpsters. The park restrooms will be open each weekend starting this weekend.

At the WWTP, The sanitary sewer lateral repair program has begun with two laterals being repaired. Appointments have been scheduled with property owners for their repairs. The Utility will start repairing the utility side of the laterals next week.

The Ridgeway Reconstruction project was advertised in the local newspaper on April 5th. The second advertisement is April 12th with a bid opening scheduled for Thursday, April 19th. A preconstruction meeting was scheduled for Monday, April 9th at 10:00 a.m. for the 2018 miscellaneous utility projects.

A meeting was held this week with Bielinske to finalize the Developer’s Agreement for Laurel Springs Addition No. 1, and discussion on water main installation costs for Jackson Drive and Cedar Creek Road.
