WATER MAIN FLUSHING OCTOBER 17th—21st

The Jackson Water Utility will be flushing the entire water system during the week of Monday, October 17th to Friday, October 21st, between the hours of 7:00AM—4:00PM.

Flushing is performed to improve the quality of your water service. You may experience a temporary interruption in service. If your service is off for more than thirty minutes, please call the Utility office at: 262-677-0707.

Use the Automatic Payment Plan to pay your Sewer and Water bill to avoid late fees.

POOL SAFETY

Did you know drowning is the #1 leading cause of injury-related death among children ages 1-4? During the hot summer months, many of us enjoy a dip in the water to cool off. If you or your child is in or near a pool, lake, or any large body of water, please follow these safety guidelines:

1. SUPERVISE – never leave a child unsupervised near a body of water. Young children should be kept within arms reach.
2. SWIMMING – teach your child how to swim by taking swimming lessons through a certified swimming organization.
3. STAY IN DESIGNATED SWIM AREAS – when at public beaches, swim only in areas set aside for swimming. Be aware of signs that may be posted about water conditions, such as currents and undertows.
4. INSTALL A FENCE/ALARM – if you own a pool, there should be a fence at least 4' tall around the pool, with a latching gate. Use an alarm that sends a alert when someone enters the pool.
5. LEARN CPR – all parents and child-care providers should know CPR and basic water rescue skills. The Jackson Fire Department holds CPR classes. Contact the Jackson Fire Department at 262-677-3811 for questions, information, or to sign up for a CPR class.






Washington County Treasurer Announces Final Property Tax Installment Due July 31

West Bend WI – Washington County Treasurer Scott M. Henke today reminds Washington County taxpayers that the final installment for their property tax is due by July 31st. If your property is in Washington County, or you have delinquent taxes, you must pay the Washington County Treasurer Scott Henke, whose office offers several options for payment.

- Checks or money orders can be mailed to the Washington County Treasurer, 432 E. Washington St. West Bend, WI 53095. Make sure that your mail receives a U.S. postmark on or before July 31st. If you would like a return receipt mailed to you, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope with your payment.
- Pay in person by check, cash or money order at the Treasurer's Office, 432 E. Washington St. West Bend, WI. Treasurer's Office is open 8:00am – 4:30pm. Monday through Friday.
- Pay using an Credit card, Debit Card or e-check online at <https://www.washcowisco.gov/cms/one.aspx?pagelD=18609325>

It is important that property owners meet the July 31st deadline. If the deadline is missed the balance on your account will be considered delinquent and subject to interest and penalty of 1 ½ % per month retroactive to February 1, 2022 (10 ½%).

This memo is a reminder that Washington County still supports a program to safely and cheaply dispose of Household Hazardous Waste and Agricultural Chemicals. This service is available Mondays and Wednesdays from 11:00AM– 6:00PM from February through November. Washington County residents will need to transport items to the Veolia Environmental Services disposal site in Menomonee Falls for disposal. The cost is \$20 and preregistration is required at www.washcoparks.com.

We would like your residents to be aware of this service and request your assistance in providing this information in your newsletters and on your website.

Additional information can be found on the above website •Click• “Clean Sweep” in the banner heading on the landing page •Click• “Full Details” at right on the next landing page. You will have access to full details on what can and cannot be accepted, dates that you can bring your items, hours of operation, and a map showing the location of the Veolia site. After reviewing the information to purchase a pass •Click• “Buy Now” located top right on that page.

Proof of Registration and Washington County residency will be required at the Veolia entrance gate. Facility operators reserve the right to refuse any substance that cannot be disposed. Please pay close attention to what can and what cannot be disposed as hazardous waste. There is also an exchange area where participants are allowed to drop off and/or take reusable materials such as cleaning or automotive products, paints/stains, and lawn & garden products at no charge. You will also find links to alternative disposal options for items other than hazardous waste.

Municipal Complex Facility Use Policy

Scope

The Village of Jackson provides meeting rooms for community use as a free public service. Public use of a meeting room is not the primary purpose of the Village and should not be allowed to disrupt the Village's ability to conduct business.

General Guidelines

The Village Board Room and Village Hall Meeting Room No. 1 are available to Village of Jackson organized non-profit groups, schools and government agencies. The rooms are available for use from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday excluding holidays. The rooms are reserved on a first come, first served basis. Reservations are not guaranteed and may be canceled at any time.

A meeting room may be reserved for use by an adult resident of the Village of Jackson. The resident of the Village must fill out and sign the Meeting Room Reservation Request Form. The Village Administrator is authorized to grant exceptions to this.

A security deposit of \$50.00 is required. The deposit will be returned to the applicant when it is deemed no damage to Village property was caused.

If problems occurring during the event, call (262) 677-9001 during normal business hours. Call 911 in any situation that requires emergency assistance from the police department, fire department or ambulance.

Regulations

1. Groups using a meeting room shall not publicize their event in any way that implies that it is sponsored, co-sponsored, endorsed, or approved by the Village unless permission to do so has been given in advance by the Village Board. Any public notice or advertisement of any meeting held in the Village Board Room or Meeting Room No. 1 must clearly state that the meeting is held at the Village facility, not sponsored by the Village of Jackson.
2. No group may use the Municipal Complex address as its own organizational address. The Village will not accept calls or relay messages to persons utilizing a meeting room.
3. All groups must abide by all local and state fire and safety laws. Fire exit doors shall not be blocked in any way. Attendance may not exceed the posted room capacity.
4. **Smoking/vaping/e-cigarettes and alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the building or on the grounds.**
5. Groups must confine their activities to the area reserved. Food and beverages are prohibited in the Village Board Room.
6. No reservations will include access to audio or video technologies. Groups may bring their own equipment and connect to the guest Wi-Fi network.
7. All groups are responsible for set-up and take down of the room. The room must be left in the same condition as it was found. Tables and chairs are to be returned to their original location. All litter must be placed in appropriate receptacles.
8. Pets are not allowed except for service dogs as defined by Americans with Disabilities Act.
9. The Village of Jackson reserves the right to cancel a reservation if at anytime the Village or Municipal Court intends to use the room for any public purpose. In the event a reservation is canceled by the Village, the security deposit will be refunded.
10. If the event is canceled by the group, the user shall contact Village staff as soon as reasonably possible. Failure to do so may result in suspension of meeting room privileges.
11. The group shall not cause or permit anything to occur whereby Village property will, in any manner, be injured, marred, defaced or damaged. Nothing may be taped, hung, tacked, etc., to any walls, windows, doors, furniture, tables or any other Village surface or object.
12. Charges for damages and/or cleaning by maintenance personnel will be billed to the applicant. Violation of any segment of this policy and/or Village Codes shall be just cause for the denial of future reservations.
13. The Village of Jackson will not be responsible for any materials, equipment or personal belongings left in the building. All goods, wares, merchandise and/or property of the group must be removed from the Village the day of use.
14. If the activity requested implies any form of hazard, risk or liability, the applicant shall be required to furnish proof of public liability and property damage insurance in specifically determined amounts which will indemnify the Village of Jackson. Such insurance must name the Village of Jackson as "additional insured" and shall specify that the Village of Jackson shall receive 10 days prior notice in writing in the event of cancellation of the policy.
15. The Village of Jackson reserves the right to refuse future use of a meeting room by a group for infringement of any rules or policies governing the use of the room.
16. It shall be the responsibility of the group to maintain peace and good order among all persons attending any activity or event at Village Hall in compliance with all applicable State and local laws and ordinances. The group shall be strictly liable to the Village for any damage which occurs within the Village Hall or to the Village Hall premises because of a breach of peace and order.
17. The Village retains the right at all times to control the management of its facilities and to enforce all necessary rules and regulations, whether or not contained in this policy.
