WATER MAIN FLUSHING OCTOBER 17th—21st

The Jackson Water Utility has scheduled flushing the entire water system the week of October 17th—October 21st, between the hours of 7:00 AM and 3:30 PM.

Flushing is performed to improve the overall quality of your water service. You may experience a brief interruption in service. If your service is off for more than thirty minutes, please call the Jackson Water Utility office at (262) 677-0707.

CAN WE FIND YOU IN AN EMERGENCY?

Every structure must have the address posted in a location that is fully visible from the street and is in contrast with the background.

Address numbers that are old, faded, non-reflective, obstructed by vegetation, architectural elements, or in an obscure area may delay an emergency response.

Please verify that your address is fully visible, as noted above. Replacement address numbers, including individual tiles, full address sets, and brackets are available at the Public Works Building located at W194N16660 Eagle Drive.

FALL BRUSH and BAG PICK-UP

Fall season weekly curbside brush chipping and bag pick-up began Monday, October 3rd, and will continue weekly through November 21st.

DO NOT rake grass or deposit leaves and other yard waste into the street. Consider registering for an access card to the Village Yard Waste Site, which is located at W194N16660 Eagle Drive.

INSPECTION REMINDER

If you have recently completed a project such as remodeling, HVAC replacement, electrical service upgrades, built a shed or fence, replaced windows/roof/siding or any other project that required permit?

A Final Inspection is Required.

Inspections help to protect you and your property against work defects and building, plumbing, electric and HVAC code deficiencies. Call 262-677-9696 for an inspection.

HOLIDAY DECORATING SAFETY REMINDERS

When placing a tree inside, be sure it is at least 3 feet away from any heat source and is not blocking any exits. Keep the tree fresh by watering daily. Make sure the lights you use are not damaged and rated for indoor use. Always turn off lights and blow out candles before leaving the home or going to bed.

When decorating, choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant. Keep candles away from decorations and other combustible items. Do not over-connect strands of lights beyond manufacturer's recommendations. Use clips, not nails, to hang lights, avoiding damage to the cords.



WINTER PARKING RULES

Beginning December 1st, on-street parking will be strictly prohibited between 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM, in order to facilitate rapid and economical snow removal. The seasonal parking ban ends April 1st. KEEP YOUR SIDEWALKS CLEAR OF SNOW AND ICE

From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Great things are happening in the Village of Jackson!

Our community continues to grow in terms of businesses, buildings, and people. The recent openings of HDI Wholesale, St. Vincent de Paul, and Genoa Healthcare are notable examples of new businesses, and Sysco's recently-begun expansion project is expected to double the size of their operations in Jackson. Individuals and families are drawn to Jackson by its safe and friendly atmosphere, great location, traditional values, and great public and parochial educational opportunities.

Washington County, and Jackson in particular, is a very attractive place to be because of the great people and because we believe in responsible and collaborative government.

In the spirit of that collaboration, the Village of Jackson is considering a request from the Village of Richfield to provide water to a limited area in order to accommodate an expansion project there. The Village Board is considering the opportunity because of the benefits it can provide to our community, but there are many factors to consider. The Board is nowhere near consensus on the topic. Any further discussion is dependent on whether or not the Village of Germantown passes a referendum allowing Richfield to connect to their system. If the referendum passes, further discussions with Jackson could be unnecessary.

Referenda for Village of Jackson citizens to consider on the November 8th ballot are being brought forward by Washington County and the Moraine Park Technical College. The outcomes of these referenda will have an effect on the quality of life in our community for many years to come. While I understand that the idea of a referendum may have a negative concept for many in our community, I don't share that view. A referendum simply gives citizens the opportunity to express their wishes at the ballot box, so it's important that each voter inform him/herself on the topic in question. While it's my opinion that approval of both of these referenda is important for our community, more information is available for your research regarding each ballot question.

Interested parties may gather more info on the Washington County Safety Initiative by attending a 5 PM meeting at one of the following sites/dates: Hartford Union High School Cafeteria, Monday, 10/10; Tower Heritage Center, West Bend, Tuesday, 10/11; Germantown High School PAC, Wednesday, 10/12; Kewaskum High School Theater, Thursday, 10/13; Washington County Fair Park, Friday, 10/14; or by following one of the "Quick Links" near the bottom of the Washington County Sheriff Department's web page: https://www.washcowisco.gov/departments/sheriff_office. Finally, this is the last Village President's newsletter that will be published before the deadline in late December to file papers to run for public office next year. While I plan to finish out my current term as Village President, I don't intend to run for the office again when my term expires. I believe the Village of Jackson has people of good will, intelligence, and diligence in our community, who could serve well in the role of Village President, but it's also my belief that it's not an entry-level position for someone who's never served in a leadership role in their workplace, church, or community. It's certainly not a position for someone who is self-serving or is looking for an edge to enhance their business or personal interests. If you're a person who is willing to commit to doing what's right for the community, to taking the necessary time for preparation and meetings, perhaps you should consider running. If not, there are many other opportunities to serve, including a current vacancy on the Zoning Board of Appeals for a term that expires in April of 2023. Please consider how you can best serve your community.

Thanks again to all those who already do what they can to make Jackson the best it can be!



RE: Washington County Clean Sweep Program – Household Hazardous Waste Disposal

This memo is a reminder that Washington County still supports a program to safely and cheaply dispose of Household Hazardous Waste and Agricultural Chemicals. This service is available Mondays and Wednesdays from 11:00AM– 6:00PM from February through November. Washington County residents will need to transport items to the Veolia Environmental Services disposal site in Menomonee Falls for disposal. The cost is \$20 and preregistration is required at www.washcoparks.com.

We would like your residents to be aware of this service and request your assistance in providing this information in your newsletters and on your website.

Additional information can be found on the above website •Click• “Clean Sweep” in the banner heading on the landing page •Click• “Full Details” at right on the next landing page. You will have access to full details on what can and cannot be accepted, dates that you can bring your items, hours of operation, and a map showing the location of the Veolia site. After reviewing the information to purchase a pass •Click• “Buy Now” located top right on that page.

Proof of Registration and Washington County residency will be required at the Veolia entrance gate. Facility operators reserve the right to refuse any substance that cannot be disposed. Please pay close attention to what can and what cannot be disposed as hazardous waste. There is also an exchange area where participants are allowed to drop off and/or take reusable materials such as cleaning or automotive products, paints/stains, and lawn & garden products at no charge. You will also find links to alternative disposal options for items other than hazardous waste.
