## Think Spring!

### Spring Clean-Up April 30th

The annual Village-Wide Spring Clean-up Day is on Saturday, April 30th, from 9:00 AM until noon. Village residents may bring bags of leaves or yard waste and household waste (TVs, microwaves, furniture, computers, and metals) to the Public Works building located at W194 N16660 Eagle Drive (just south of Tennes ACE Hardware). Yard waste should be placed into biodegradable paper bags. Be prepared to show identification to verify Village of Jackson residency. Questions? Call Public Works at 262-677-0707.

### Brush Chipping and Yard Waste

Brush chipping and bag pick-up will begin Monday, May 2nd, and continue each Monday until May 31st. (Tuesday after Memorial Day). During the summer months, brush chipping and bag pick-up will occur monthly on the third Monday of each month. The dates are: June 20th, July 18th, August 15th, and September 19th. Pick-up may also occur after a major storm. **Bags with only fresh grass clippings will be tagged and will not be picked up.** To drop off yard waste, yard waste site access cards are available Monday-Friday from 7:30 AM – 4 PM at the Public Works building located at W194 N16660 Eagle Drive. Passes allow for site access seven (7) days a week.

### Got Weeds?

Weeds, overgrown grass, and other vegetation are a common property maintenance complaint. Untrimmed grass and weeds can be unsightly, but they can also promote rodent and insect activity in your yard.

Weeds in sidewalks and other hard-surface areas can also present trip hazards as well as cause decay and deterioration of the material.



## **Watermain Flushing April 18th—April 22nd**

The Jackson Water Utility will begin flushing water mains throughout the water service area Monday, April 18th, through Friday, April 22nd, between 7:00 AM and 4:00 PM. Semi-annual watermain flushing is performed to improve the quality of your water service.

You may experience a brief interruption in service. If your water service remains off for more than thirty minutes, call the Water Utility Clerk at 262-677-0707. Run the cold water before you wash clothes or dishes. If discoloration is experienced in the cold water, let it run until it clears.

## **Fire Pit Reminders**

The Village of Jackson does not allow outdoor burning of yard waste or debris. Recreational fires are permitted, but shall be contained and 15 feet from lot lines and structures. Burning is only permitted for clean, dry wood without use of flammable or combustible liquids to start a fire. Recreational fires must have means to be extinguished immediately and shall always be attended by a competent adult. For more information, call the Jackson Fire Department at 262-677-3811.



## **THE BENEFITS OF BUILDING PERMITS**



Obtaining the proper permits for your project means more than just a Village Inspector visiting your home or business. Permits help to ensure that the work performed, item installed, repair or replacement is done so in accordance with applicable code requirements.

Work that is done without necessary permits not only violates Village and State law, but it is also often incorrect and unsafe, putting you and your property at risk.

Obtaining permits for your project or installation is a small investment that offers peace of mind and can protect you in the event of inexperienced or unlicensed contractors or improper workmanship.

A contractor that states *“you don’t need a permit for that”* should be an immediate red flag. Work beyond routine or small repairs will likely require a permit. We often hear *“I was told that if I’m the homeowner I don’t need to pull a permit”*. Unfortunately, this is also not true as permit requirements are driven by the scope of work, not who performs it.

Your estimate or contract may spell out who is responsible for obtaining permits. If your contractor will be obtaining permits on your behalf, be sure to verify that they have obtained the necessary permit(s) by requesting a copy of the issued permit or by calling your local Inspection Department directly.

Some contractors require the property owner to obtain all permits. This should also be an immediate red flag as it could indicate they are not properly licensed or insured and therefore unable to obtain permits under State Law. You should ALWAYS ask your contractor for a valid Certificate of Insurance and when required, proof of licensing. Legitimate contractors will have no issue providing you this information. The above items should always be verified PRIOR to any work commencing.

Some of the more common projects that require a permit(s) include re-roofing and re-siding, bathroom, kitchen and basement remodeling, foundation repair, appliance replacement (furnaces, A/C, water heaters, water softeners, dishwashers, etc.), decks, sheds, fences, hot tubs and pools (whether permanent or temporary, and driveway approach and sidewalk installations or replacement.

Washington County, in conjunction with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), will host a public involvement meeting to present proposed improvements for the following project:

### **County P Improvement Project**

The County P improvement project begins at the intersection of WIS 145 and extends northerly to WIS 60. The purpose of the project is to address a deteriorating pavement structure and cross culverts, and evaluate the vertical geometry and sight distance of the roadway. Proposed improvements include reconstructing the roadway to improve vertical profiles, increase sight distances, add turn lanes, widen the paved shoulder, replace deteriorating cross culverts, and extend an existing box culvert to enhance safety and efficiency of the roadway.

The WisDOT funded project limits are from WIS 145 to approximately 300' north of Sherman Road. The Washington County funded project limits are from approximately 300' north of Sherman Road to WIS 60.

Construction is currently scheduled for 2024. The section of County P being improved will be closed to through traffic during construction with a posted detour.

### **Please attend**

To find out about the proposed project, interested persons are encouraged to attend the public involvement meeting scheduled for **5:30 pm to 6:30 pm on Thursday, April 14, 2022 at the Village of Jackson Municipal Complex located at N168 W19851 Main Street, Jackson, WI 53037. There will be a brief presentation at 5:45 pm.** The facility is wheelchair accessible. Hearing impaired persons needing assistance should contact the Wisconsin Telecommunication Relay System (dial 711) at least three working days prior to the meeting.

### **Information available**

Representatives from Washington County, WisDOT, and Gremmer & Associates (design consultant), will be available to explain the proposed improvements and obtain your feedback on the identified needs and proposed improvements. Exhibits showing the proposed improvements will be on display and take home material will be available to provide additional information on the project.
