## Municipal Complex Dedication

The Municipal Complex is the next home to the Village Police Department, Fire Department and Administrative Offices. The building was dedicated to the Community on October 5th, as pictured above. The construction of the facility was authorized by the Village Board in Spring of 2020 and will achieve partial significant completion in October of 2021. Final touches to the building will be underway throughout the winter season. Next steps include permanent installation of exterior lighting, exterior signage, interior speaker wiring and placement of monitors.

## **WATER MAIN FLUSHING OCTOBER 18th—22nd**

The Jackson Water Utility will begin flushing the entire water system Monday, October 18th through Friday, October 22nd between 7:00 AM and 3:30 PM.

Flushing is performed to improve the overall quality of your water service. You may experience a brief interruption in service. If your service is off for more than thirty minutes, please call the Utility office at: 262-677-0707.

## **JACKSON POLICE DEPARTMENT PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK** **Saturday, October 23rd 9:00 AM to Noon**

The Jackson Police Department, in cooperation with the Department of Justice (DOA) and Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), will participate in National Prescription Drug Take Back Day on Saturday, October 23rd from 9:00 AM to Noon, at the entrance of the Municipal Complex located at N168 W19851 Main Street. An officer will help you dispose of the acceptable items (see list below) – No Questions Asked.

**BRING:** Unused prescriptions (controlled and non-controlled) and over-the-counter medications, ointments, creams, vials, patches, non-aerosol sprays, inhalers, and pet medications.

**DO NOT BRING:** Illegal drugs, needles/sharps, acids, aerosol cans, bio-hazardous materials (anything containing blood or bodily fluids,) or personal care products (such as shampoo, soaps, lotions, or sunscreens), mercury thermometers, or household hazardous waste (such as paint, pesticides, oil, or gasoline). Liquids will be accepted, however liquids, creams, or sprays must be in their original packaging or they will not be accepted. Empty pill bottles will be defaced and donated to the Washington County Humane Society for their use with packaging pet medications.

## *From the Desk of the Village President . . .*

Great things continue to happen in the Village of Jackson!

By the time you receive this publication, the new Village of Jackson Municipal Complex will have been dedicated and I hope many members of the community had the opportunity to tour the facility at the Open House. Construction of a building to house the Fire and Police Departments had been under consideration for many years, before the project was approved on March 17, 2020. The project is expected to be completed under budget. Administration, Police Department, and Fire Department are expected to fully occupy the new building by the end of October.

The Village Board has requested proposals from Commercial Brokers interested in selling the property that currently hosts the Village Hall and Police Station. While no proposals have been received to date, many individuals have speculated as to possible uses for the building that would provide benefit both for the community and the new owners. Ultimately, any proposed use of the building and/or site is subject Plan Commission and Village Board approval.

The building currently home to the Jackson Fire Department is already owned by the West Bend School District in anticipation of a school building project on that site and the adjoining site. Development is next anticipated to occur around the new Municipal Complex. The surrounding parcels are in a tax increment district, and with the infrastructure created for the Municipal Complex, it has become an appealing location for further development. Washington County Executive Josh Schoemann attended the September Village Board meeting and presented ideas for workforce housing that may be an ideal fit in that area.

With the release of the new district map for the Washington County Board of Supervisors, a supervisory district has been created which encompasses the Village of Jackson. Individuals interested in serving the Village of Jackson as a County Board Supervisor are encouraged to visit the Washington County website for further information.

Residents and visitors to the Village of Jackson alike enjoy the natural beauty of Hasmer Lake. In its long range planning activities, the Village of Jackson Parks and Recreation Department has long considered the possibility of creating a park at Hasmer Lake a high priority. Recently, property adjacent to the DNR public access became available, and the Village Board authorized the Village Administrator to enter into negotiations with the seller for the purchase of the property. The purchase of the property, using Park Impact Fees, will be the first step in creating an attractive location for our community to enjoy.

Thanks to all who think, work, and act to make the Village of Jackson a great place for all of us!

### **WINTER SAFETY REMINDERS**

When placing a tree inside, be sure it is at least 3 feet away from any heat source and is not blocking any exits. Keep the tree fresh by watering daily. Make sure the lights you use are not damaged and rated for indoor use. Always turn off lights before leaving the home or going to bed.

When decorating, choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant. Keep candles away from decorations and other combustible items. Do not over-connect strands of lights beyond manufacturer's recommendations. Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so that cords do not get damaged. Be sure to blow out candles before leaving the home, or going to bed.

### **KEEP YOUR SIDEWALKS CLEAR OF SNOW AND ICE**

Property owners are reminded to keep all public sidewalks completely clear of snow and ice, along the full width and length of the sidewalk. Sidewalks must be cleared with 24 hours after snow or ice ceases to fall.

Failure to maintain sidewalks in a clear and safe manner may result in the issuance of a municipal citation.
