SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY

As a reminder, the speed limit in school zones is **15 m.p.h.** Motorists are required to yield to pedestrians in a crosswalk, and also to follow the direction of the crossing guards.

WISCONSIN HOME ENERGY PLUS

Heating bills a struggle? Applying for the Wisconsin Home Energy Plus (WHEAP) program is as easy as 1, 2, 3!

The WHEAP program runs through May 15, 2019. The program offers a one time payment per household, per heating season to assist with your utility cost.

All applicants must meet the **three-month gross income** eligibility limit.

PET LICENSES

All dog and cats five months of age or older must be licensed by January 1, 2019. After March 31, 2019, an additional \$10.00 late fee will be assessed. A copy of the pet's rabies certificate is required before a license will be issued. Dog license fees: Unaltered \$15, Neutered/Spayed \$10.00. Cat license fees: Unaltered \$10.00, Neutered/Spayed \$7.00.

From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Many people associated with the Village are already aware of two important building projects being discussed in the Village of Jackson.

The existing 50 year old metal building housing the Fire Department originally served as the Ocean Spray Cranberry company's maintenance building. The Police Department uses the west half of the Village office building that was vacated when the east addition was built.

I believe both facilities are long overdue for replacement, and I appreciate the patience of our Police and Fire Departments as we work through the planning process.

Plans are in the works for a new Public Safety building on the south side of Highway 60 between Eagle Drive and Ridgeway Drive. The present owners of that property have accepted the Village of Jackson's offer to purchase. Pending satisfaction of several of the offer's contingencies, the Village should take possession of the property by the 1st of February, with an anticipated construction start date in September of 2019 and completion in October of 2020.

Financial projections indicate that with anticipated building and development costs of \$13.5 million for the Public Safety building, Village tax rates for debt service will continue to drop in the coming years.

While the second building project is not a project that the Village of Jackson will be undertaking, a new Jackson Elementary School building would be a great benefit for the West Bend School District and the Jackson community if approved by the voters of the district.

For at least twenty years there has been talk of replacing the aging structure on Jackson Drive. At a November 26, 2018 meeting, electors of the School District voted 84-14 to proceed with the purchase of the Jackson Public Works and Fire Department properties on Jackson Drive. The purchase of these properties provides the School District enough space north of the Jackson Community Center for a new elementary school. The purchase agreement between the School District and the Village of Jackson will allow the Fire Department to occupy its existing quarters until the Village Public Safety Building is complete.

I think it's important for our community that Jackson Elementary be replaced with a building that meets the standards established elsewhere by the West Bend School District, allows safer access for young students, and allows for a better educational experience overall, both inside and outside the classroom.

When, and if these projects are both completed, they will be a great benefit to our community.
