COUNTY TRUNK HWY P TO BE RECONSTRUCTED

The Washington County Highway Department has reported that from mid-May to October, 2018, it will be reconstructing CTH P for approximately 1.3 miles from STH 60 north to Woodland Drive. Improvements within the project limits will include: sightline lengthening, intersection bypass and turn lanes, a bolstered pavement structure and width, and a multitude of safety upgrades.

During the project, the construction area will be closed to through traffic. Access will be allowed only to the property owners directly impacted by construction operations. This will help the contractors to safely and efficiently complete their work in a timely manner.

The project will be constructed in phases, to allow for limited access during the time of the County Fair during July 24th through the 29th.

Please begin to determine alternate travel routes north of STH 60 toward West Bend and south of Woodland Drive toward the Village of Jackson.

JACKSON WATER UTILITY TO FLUSH WATER MAINS

Postponed by the recent snowfall, the Jackson Water Utility will now be flushing water mains throughout the water service area from April 23rd through April 27th. All flushing will be done between 7:00 am and 4:00 pm. Flushing is performed to improve the quality of your water service.

MEDIATED COOPERATIVE PLAN AGREEMENT

The Mediated Cooperative Plan Agreement Between the Village of Jackson and the Town of Jackson was jointly submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Administration (DOA) on December 4, 2017. This agreement was to replace the original and longstanding Boundary Agreement jointly signed in 1999.

After two public hearings, additional comment, and waiting periods, the DOA has stated it will provide its decision by Thursday, April 19, 2018.

From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Great things are happening in the Village of Jackson!

At its last meeting, the Village Board approved the purchase of a new aerial ladder truck for the fire department. Upon its delivery sometime next year, it's expected the new ladder truck will serve the village for the next 25 years, providing added capabilities and enhanced safety for our dedicated firefighters.

The Board also approved a concept plan for Maplewood Farms that would include sidewalks and lighting similar to other subdivisions in the Village. Maplewood Farms is a proposed single family subdivision development on land that will be brought into the Village pending Department of Administration approval of the Mediated Cooperative Plan between the Village of Jackson and the Town of Jackson. A decision on the Cooperative Plan from the Department of Administration is expected on April 19th.

Additional development is planned as an expansion of the Laurel Springs subdivision. As it moves forward, that development will occupy the remaining space west of Jackson Drive to the railroad tracks and north of Laurel Springs to Cedar Creek Road. In addition, a concept plan for a condominium development west of Jackson

Drive and north of Cedar Creek Road was also approved recently.

These developments provide the opportunity for many more families to enjoy and contribute to the great community of Jackson. We look forward to their development and wish the developers the greatest success.

Washington County is working to rebuild County Trunk Highway P north from Highway 60. As part of that work, turning lanes will be added for the newly-created tax increment district Number 6 along County Trunk Highway P. This development makes additional space available in the business park for commercial and industrial development in addition to the residential development opportunities mentioned.

A new concept plan for the Mill on South Street was presented both to the Plan Commission and to the Village Board at their most recent meetings. Both groups received the concept enthusiastically. Presented by some of the same people behind the Terrace 167 venue in Richfield, the plans are for a smaller venue to serve the needs of families. We look forward to working with the development group to help their ideas come to fruition.

He will be occupying the Board position vacated when Mike Kufahl decided not to run for another term. Incumbent board members John Kruepke and Debbie Kurtz were reelected.

With people moving in and out of the Village and taking different positions on the various boards and committees, we are occasionally looking for people who are willing to serve. Most of the boards and committees meet monthly, others meet annually, still others only meet on an as-needed basis. No matter how often or infrequently they meet, open positions need to be filled. If you are interested in serving on any one of the boards and committees, we're looking to fill positions on the Ethics Committee, the Community Development Authority, and, in the near future, will be looking to fill a position on the Police and Fire Commission.

We appreciate the willingness of our residents to serve their community in these positions. For the most part, all that's required is the willingness to get involved, to learn, to be open to different points of view, and to offer an opinion based on what you believe will be in the best long-term interest of the greater community. Finally, although we've had our share of cold weather and snow, spring is on its way. And with spring comes the anticipation of Action in Jackson. BUILDING INSPECTIONS

Spring is here and soon the warm weather will follow. With the warm weather come various projects that require building permits. All decks, sheds, fences, spas, pools (permanent and temporary pools), recreation rooms, siding, window replacements, furnaces, water heaters, softeners, and roofing projects require permits. JACKSON FIRE DEPARTMENT

A few summertime fire safety tips:

Outdoor grilling with charcoal and propane

- Be careful when lighting grills.
- Never grill indoors.
- Keep grills away from buildings and from under eaves.
- Have a 3 ft "Kids Safe Zone" around grill.

Fire Pits

- Metal manufactured fire pits are preferred.
- No burning within 15 ft of building or lot line.
- Fire should be under constant supervision by an adult.
- Extinguish fire and cover pit when finished.
