Village Project Updates

Parks—The Village completed the application of the anti-slip surface at the Splash Pad this spring. The added surface increases safety of families.

Utilities— The 2025 Wastewater Treatment Plant Phase 1 is wrapping up ahead of schedule, and is expected to be completed in Mid-July 2025. Phase 2 will begin in 2026.

Hickory Lane— Construction began at the end of June after a slight delay. Storm sewer installation in Phase 1 will be completed at the end of July. One lane on Hickory will remain open at all times to local traffic only. Phase 2 south of Cedar Creek Road will begin in August, with final completion of the project at the end of September.

Ridgeway Drive/Chestnut Court -

Underground construction will continue into July as we complete sanitary/storm sewer laterals along with water main service transfers. The road remains closed to through traffic. Road grading, curb and gutter, and sidewalks and driveways will begin in July and continue into August.

Restoration and asphalt pavement will begin in August into September, with final completion in September.

The Jackson Fire Department is reliant on having a strong base of teammates from the community working as paid on-call members. These are your friends and neighbors who live in Jackson, work full-time or part-time jobs outside of the Fire Department, and want to serve their community. Paid on-call members go through certification training to get licensed at the EMT level as well as Fire Fighter 1. This allows them to train with the department and answer calls on night shifts and weekends alongside our full-time staff. Water Main Flushing October 13th - 17th

The Jackson Water Utility will be flushing the entire water system from Monday, October 13th to Friday, October 17th, between the hours of 7AM and 4PM. Flushing improves the quality of your water service. You may experience a temporary interruption in service. If your service is off for more than 30 minutes, or your water doesn't clear up after running the tap, please call the Utility office at 262-677-0707.

Brush Chipping and Yard Waste

Brush chipping and yard-waste bag pick-up will occur on the following Mondays: July 21st, August 18th, and September 15th. Fall Pick up will begin October 6 and continue throughout the month of October on Mondays. Have your 4'x4'x4' pile of brush and/or bags to be picked up curbside by 7AM on Monday. Grass clippings are not accepted curbside. Bags with grass clippings-only will be tagged and not picked up. Residents may dump yard waste at the Yard Waste Site by obtaining a Site Access Card from the Public Works and Inspections Building located at W194N16660 Eagle Drive, Monday through Friday, 7:30AM - 4PM. Call 262-677-0707 with questions. Please note: Brush is no longer accepted at the Village Yard Waste Site and is only collected curbside. Special dates for collection may be added after a major storm.



From the Desk of the Village President . . .

Action in Jackson!! I'm sure most of you have heard over the past month or so that our annual community festival took place at the end of May. I would like to thank Jackson Festivals, and the groups that volunteer, for their time and effort spent coordinating Action in Jackson, as well as the John and Marian Kruepke family, who sponsored the amazing fireworks again this year. Seeing our community come out to enjoy the festivities is part of what makes living in Jackson so great.

Action in Jackson, however, is not the only action in the Village. Road construction projects for 2025 are now in full swing with contractors continuing the reconstruction of Ridgeway Drive and Chestnut Court, and work now commenced on the Hickory Lane project from Stonehedge Drive to Linden Drive. I know these projects can be an inconvenience to maneuver around, but please respect the road closures because the end-product will be well worth the temporary disruption.

Other action in Jackson includes a project that isn't visible when driving around; Phase 1 of the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project is in its final stages and is coming in under budget and ahead of schedule. This will allow us to remain in compliance with Department of Natural Resources permitting requirements.

Finally, action is ramping up on budget planning for 2026. We're currently evaluating a variety of items—from employee wages to potential capital improvements, including additional road projects. As always, we remain committed to maintaining quality services while doing our best to keep taxes as low as possible.
