Police Department

This week, Staff completed annual Taser recertification training with in-house Taser Instructor Officer Oswald. JPD is required to review the Taser training documentation, policy, and to deploy several Taser cartridges annually. JPD also completed annual security awareness training, which is administered by the Village's I.T. servicer. As JPD's wellness coordinator, Officer Welch attended a one-day training at CVMIC, titled "Officer Wellness". The first night of the Jackson Citizen's Police Academy went very well. Chief Vossekul welcomed the participants and provided an overview of the department. The group then toured the Police and Fire Departments.

Fire Department

Last week, Jackson Fire and EMS personnel responded to 14 medical calls and two (2) fire calls, which consisted of an accident involving a semi and a truck. JFD also responded to a car which lost control on Hwy 45 and a person was taken to a local hospital. At the station, a flooring contractor has returned to fix the apparatus bay floor and the work is expected to occur throughout the next week. Contractors are also in the building addressing warranty work.
