Police Department

This week, Staff attended several meetings, including a Washington County Human Services roundtable, a Washington County Heroin Task Force (Elevate, Inc.) meeting, and a CVMIC Law Enforcement Virtual roundtable and training. Detective Foeger and Officer Krueger attended the Wisconsin Association for Identification Annual Conference this week. Training topics included property and evidence management, crime scene investigations, and a legal update.

On Tuesday morning at 2:33 AM, an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for reckless driving and suspended registration. The driver, a 22-year-old Milwaukee man, was arrested for operating while under the influence (first offense, drug-related). During a search of the vehicle, marijuana and a .45 caliber handgun were located. All three (3) occupants of the vehicle were charged with carrying a concealed weapon. The driver was cited for OWI, operating without a license (2nd offense), suspended registration and possession of THC (marijuana).

“Congratulations” to Officer Katie Brogli for completing her field training program on Thursday. Officer Brogli has successfully completed her “on-the-job” initial training and has been certified for solo patrol. Officer Brogli will be assigned to the second shift. Lastly, the March Activity Report (included to the right) shows how busy JPD was this month, including 29 criminal arrests and 18 drug arrests.



Fire Department

Last week, Jackson Fire Department responded to 14 medical calls and three (3) fire calls, including two (2) Carbon Monoxide calls and an electrical issue. Monday night's training focused on fire call scene training in settings of commercial business operations and single-family home responses. This week, JFD Staff focused on promoting Tornado Safety Awareness. Statewide tornado drills were conducted on Thursday at 1:45 PM and 6:45 PM. Building Inspection

Occupancy was issued for the single-family home located at W208 N16365 Renee Way. Permit were issued for the main construction phase for the addition at Morning Star Lutheran School. More than 260 permits have been issued so far this year which is just slightly ahead of last year's near record pace. Interior concrete floors have been poured at the Genoa Healthcare building. The project will now move to the interior finishing phase.

Administration

Staff dedicated time this week to administering the Spring 2022 election on Tuesday and the Board of Canvassing was completed on Friday. The voter turnout was 26% of registered voters, with a total of 1,314 ballots cast, which includes 294 absentee ballots and 45 Election Day Registrations. The total votes for Village Trustee: Brian Heckendorf-854, John Krupeke-733, Traci Wells-723 and Debbie Kurtz-546. "Thank you" to the election workers, DPW staff that did the heavy lifting to set up, and Dairy Queen for the donation of Dilly Bars for workers!

The Village Board meeting on Tuesday, April 12, 2022, will include zoning and site approvals for the Sysco expansion project and the proposed use of the former Village Hall and Police Department.
