Re: Weekly Update



### **Police Department**

Last Friday night, an officer stopped a vehicle on Ridgeway Drive that was driving without headlamps. The driver, a 36-year-old Milwaukee woman, was in possession of methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia, and a handgun. Her passenger, a 36-year-old Milwaukee man, was in possession of a handgun and is prohibited from doing so due to his status as a convicted felon. Germantown Police Department's K9 Unit assisted with this investigation. Prior to transporting the suspects to jail, an unrelated call came in for an armed home invasion robbery on Stonewall Drive. Deputies from the Washington County Sheriff's Office transported the suspects to jail, while JPD officers responded to the robbery. It was learned that four (4) suspects entered a residence, battered two (2) victims, and stole and damaged property. It was determined that a resident, who was victimized by the suspects, was engaging in an illegal transaction with the suspects. This was an isolated incident and is under investigation. JPD would like to assure residents there is no threat to the community at this time.

In addition to many other significant calls for service, several unrelated domestic disturbances occurred this week, including JPD's response to a report of an erratic driver on STH 60. The vehicle was located, and a 35-year-old West Bend man was arrested for operating while under the influence with a minor passenger in the car. On Thursday at 12:26 AM, a high-speed-pursuit ensued when an officer attempted to stop a stolen vehicle on Cedar Parkway. The vehicle fled south on Highway 45. The Germantown Police Department and the Wisconsin State Patrol assisted by spiking the tires on the suspect's vehicle as it entered the Village of Germantown. The suspect pulled over and fled from the vehicle on foot. A drone was utilized to locate the suspect, a 30-year-old Milwaukee man. He was taken into custody and charges were referred to the Washington County District Attorney's Office.

On Tuesday, JPD hosted the Annual National Night Out event at Hickory Lane Park. A record crowd of over 800 people attended. JPD Staff were humbled and grateful for the turnout and would like to especially thank the businesses and residents that donated to this event. Also, "thank you" to fellow village departments that dedicated time and talents to this event including Jackson Fire Department, Parks and Recreation Department, and Department of Public Works. Planning is already underway for National Night Out 2023!

### **Fire Department**

Last week, Jackson Fire and EMS personnel responded to 23 medical calls, 27 inspections, and two (2) fire calls, which consisted of a motor vehicle accident and false alarm. The motor vehicle accident took place at the intersection of Eagle Drive and STH 60. Monday night's training consisted of forcible entry exercises. Crews were able to practice in the new training building with the forcible entry door.

Chief Swaney and Administrator Keller reviewed the draft report for the 2022 Jackson Fire and EMS Organizational Study. The majority of the report is complete, and a final presentation of the report will be provided to the public later in September or early October. JFD also staffed the Washington County Fair, which concluded Sunday. Overall, it was a safe event with a handful of medical emergencies. All rides, food trucks, booths, and facilities were inspected and compliant. Staff will coordinate with fairground Staff for a better set up in the future, so that means of egress is not hindered.

### **Parks and Recreation**

Don't forget the Hickory Lane Splash Pad is free to everyone and open daily from 10:00 AM-7:00 PM through September 5<sup>th</sup>. Also, discounted attraction tickets are for sale at the Jackson Community Center during regular business hours through September 2<sup>nd</sup>. Attractions include Noah's Ark, Pirates Cove Adventure Golf, Mt. Olympus, Milwaukee County Zoo, WI Ducks, Upper Dells Boat Tours, and Jet Boat Adventure Tours.

Families are also reminded to register for the JCC 4K, which begins in September. Children may open enroll to the JCC from other communities that offer 4K (i.e. Germantown, Slinger, Cedarburg, etc.). ### **Public Works**

The Street and Parks Department Crew continued routine summer maintenance and replaced the recirculation pump at the Hickory Lane Splash Pad, which caused a closure over the weekend. A mowing trailer axel was damaged this week and will be repaired shortly. Also, the Village is requesting employment applications and resumes for the open Streets and Parks Maintenance Position, which will be open for applications until Friday, August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The Jackson Water Utility Crew addressed requests for locate services and meter changeouts. Staff also commenced installation of a new chlorine pump at Well #3; the well will be offline until replacement is complete. Lastly, valves were adjusted on Rosewood Lane prior to the final lift of asphalt, which is expected to occur next week.

The Jackson Sewer Utility was at the Washington County Fair last week for education requirements of the DNR Permit for Wastewater and Storm Water Management. Over 2,000 visitors were greeted at the booth! Staff also dedicated time this week addressing submitted work orders, requests for maintenance, and repairing a manhole. Seven (7) more sanitary laterals were televised on Main Street this week and the Maple Fields Subdivision Phase 1 utility installation continued with the sanitary sewer heading east towards Maple Road.

### **Building Inspection**

Partial Occupancy was granted for the warehouse area at HDI Wholesale on Caymus Court. This allows the business to begin operations in advance of the school year, which constitutes a large percentage of their business. Plans and permits were submitted for a new single-family home in the English Oaks subdivision and another single-family home in the Laurel Springs Addition No. 1 subdivision. Finishing work is nearing completion for the second-floor classrooms at Morning Star Lutheran School, in anticipation of the upcoming school year.

### **Administration**

Staff dedicated time this week preparing for several public meetings occurring next Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, which will take place at the Jackson Community Center located at N168W20330 Hickory Lane. Starting at 6:00 PM, the meetings will include the Personnel Committee, Budget and Finance Committee, and the Village Board. There were also several hours dedicated towards budget preparation and election preparation. The Village's 2023-2024 CVMIC Insurance renewal was completed and submitted online this week. On Tuesday, August 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Public Test for the August 9<sup>th</sup> Partisan Primary Election was conducted by the Chief Election Inspectors. The training for the Election Inspectors was held on Wednesday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>.

The polls for the Partisan Primary Election will be open from 7:00 AM until 8:00 PM on Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup>. All Village of Jackson electors will vote at the Jackson Municipal Complex. Please remember that valid Photo ID is required to vote. Absentee ballots are required to be returned by the voter to the Village Clerk's Office no later than 8:00 PM on Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup> in order to be counted.

Development work continued this week as well. The TID #7 plan amendment was approved by the Joint Review Board on Thursday. In the upcoming week, Staff will begin working with the interested developer, so that site approvals can commence in August or September. Staff also worked with Sysco to finalize forthcoming documentation related to past Village Board approvals for the expansion. Lastly, Staff dedicated time on Friday meeting with EDWC to continue work on the Village's development of the 5-acre commercial parcel located west of the Municipal Complex.
