Fire Department

Monday night's training consisted of an officers meeting. The fire training committee also met to plan upcoming training.

On Tuesday evening, Jackson Festivals, Inc. held their Action in Jackson wrap-up meeting, and the committee would again like to thank all the volunteers, sponsors, and participants for supporting this awesome community event! Save the date for Action in Jackson 2023, which is scheduled for June 9th and 10th. On Wednesday, the West Bend School District conducted a Leadership Team Summit. The summit had small teams representing each school; Kelly Valentino and Angie Jeske were selected to represent the 4K Early Program Partner Sites. The teams worked on data evaluation, mission statements, staff agreements, and team building. The work will continue throughout the year. Also, there was an article in the MKE Magazine featuring Jackson as one of the communities listed in the "Hottest Real Estate" article.

At the Jackson Community Center (JCC) this week, Kwik Trip held a community Job Fair on Wednesday, the monthly StockBox program also occurred on Wednesday, and the Quilting Guild held their annual workshop on Friday evening.

Building Inspection

Construction has begun on a new home in the Cobblestone Meadows subdivision. Final construction and Occupancy inspections were completed on two (2) homes in the Laurel Springs Addition No. 1 subdivision. Interior floor slab and exterior concrete flatwork were completed on the Elite Tool project as well, and the State of WI Plan Approval was received for the Sysco expansion project.

Public Works

The Street and Parks Department Crew assisted with election set up this week, continued the regular summer maintenance of parks and public green spaces, and Staff attended the APWA Wisconsin Snowplow Rodeo and equipment show. Minor street repairs were made to Jackson Drive in front of the Jackson Elementary School. Also, the TID #6 roadway, Caymus Court, had the final list of asphalt installed this week. The only remaining work in this development is the installation of streetlights, which will complete the list of anticipated TID #6 expenditures.

The Village is requesting employment applications and resumes for the open Streets and Parks Maintenance Position, which will be open for applications until Friday, August 19th, 2022. For more information or to apply, please visit the [Village of Jackson Career Page](#).

The Jackson Water Utility continued with locates and meter changeouts. Well #3 has been placed back online; additional trouble shooting is needed, as the meter is not communicating with the SCADA System. Staff are also obtaining quotes for changing the meters in Wells #4, #5 and #6. A new 2-inch meter has been installed for the Morning Star Lutheran School addition. Lastly, “congratulations” to Water Operator, Luke Paulus, for his one-year work anniversary with the Jackson Water Utility!

At the Wastewater Treatment Plant, the crew replaced the wheel on the Schreiber tank. Our new PO4 analyzer broke, and a new part is due to arrive on Monday. Samples are continuing to be collected for the DNR reapplication permit. The lawn mowing trailer is back in service, after the front axle was replaced. Lastly, Staff are requesting quotes for services with a new testing lab company.

Administration

Staff dedicated time this week to preparing for and administering the Partisan Primary Election on Tuesday, meeting with interested engineering firms to participate in the Next Generation Housing pilot site in Jackson, continuing the budget preparation efforts, and welcoming County Executive Josh Schoemann for the Town Hall meeting hosted in the Village Board Room on Friday.

Tuesday’s Partisan Primary Election had a record voter turnout of 41% of registered voters. A total of 2,003 ballots were cast, which included 410 absentee ballots and 101 Election Day Registrations. The election ran efficiently with the assistance of 28 dedicated Election Inspectors, DPW, JFD, and Administrative Staff. “Thank you” to these individuals for all of the help! We look forward to seeing voters again for the General Election on November 8th, 2022.
