Re: Weekly Update



Police Department

Officer John Joerger has been selected to be the Jackson Police Department's Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group (WILEAG) accreditation manager. Officer Joerger will undergo training and begin the process of re-certifying the Department's state accreditation for the 2020-2022 reporting period. Staff were also busy this week preparing for the inaugural citizen's police academy class, which starts on Sept. 7th.

JPD would like to say "thank you" to Brooke Sammons for her eight (8) years of service as a crossing guard for the Village of Jackson. Brooke has accepted a position elsewhere, and Staff wish her well in the future. Community members will remember Brooke as the friendly and interactive crossing guard that served at the intersection of Jackson Drive and Main Street.

Three suspects are in custody following a July armed home invasion robbery. On August 25, 2022, Jackson officers executed a search warrant related to this investigation within the 5300 block of West Galena Street located in the City of Milwaukee. A 26-year-old Milwaukee woman and a 29-year-old Milwaukee man were taken into custody. A 20-year-old Milwaukee woman was also taken into custody at another location. Charges have been referred to the Washington County District Attorney's office for armed robbery, criminal damage to property, substantial battery, and felons in possession of a firearm. The Jackson Police Department was assisted at the scene by the Milwaukee Police Department Tactical Enforcement Unit and the Washington County Sheriff's Office. Fire Department

Last week, Jackson Fire and EMS personnel responded to 17 medical calls, 49 inspections, and two (2) fire calls, which consisted of a gas leak and a mutual aid call to Germantown that was cancelled prior to arrival. Monday night's training consisted of EMS focused topics, including a new training module that allows members to complete training on their own.

Parks and Recreation

Staff dedicated time this week to cleaning, organizing, painting, and last-minute preparations for the WBSD Early Learning program, Boys & Girls Club programming, and fall recreation programming to commence! New carpet is currently being installed in the Jackson Community Center (JCC) games room/lounge, thanks to the Boys & Girls Club. All remaining carpets/rugs were professionally cleaned and sanitized this week as well. Staff are also working with Northland Recreation and No Fault to schedule warranty repairs to the Hickory Lane Park inclusive playground surface material.

Families are also reminded to register for the JCC 4K, which begins in September. Children may open enroll to the JCC from other communities that offer 4K (i.e. Germantown, Slinger, Cedarburg, etc.). Building Inspection

Final inspections were completed on the HDI Wholesale, Inc. project. Occupancy is anticipated for some time next week and the grand opening is scheduled for September 22nd. Occupancy inspections were completed on two (2) additional condo units in the Stonewall Ridge subdivision. Lastly, preliminary sitework has commenced on the Sysco expansion project.

Public Works

The Street and Parks Department Crew picked up brush that was set out late or missed during last week's scheduled curbside chipping. Next month, the bag and brush curbside collection will occur the week of September 19th. Line painting for the school zone has been completed. Mowing, ballfield prep, and maintenance were some of the other items completed this week.

The Jackson Water Utility Crew welcomed Justyn Krueger as the newest Water Operator for the Village. The Department is now back to full staffing levels at the Jackson Water Utility! At the Wastewater Treatment Plant, Staff continues to address work orders and requests for maintenance. The Sewer and Water Utilities worked together this week to repair a broken storm sewer line on North Center Street. Lastly, the Maple Fields Subdivision continued installation of sanitary sewer and water main this week.

Administration

This week, Staff met with financial advisors from Ehlers to discuss TID #6 funds, capital projects planning, and the 2023 levy limit. There were also conversations with the architect/engineers from Cedar Corporation regarding outstanding warranty issues at the Municipal Complex. Also, the Village received the August Property Tax Settlement from Washington County in the amount of \$1,246,685.13. This amount includes 2021 second-half tax installments and any other unpaid taxes for the Village. The Village was awarded \$75.00 by the Wisconsin Elections Commission for the 2022 HAVA Election Security.gov Email Domain Subgrant. Clerk Dobratz attended the 42nd annual Wisconsin Municipal Clerks Association Conference; sessions included alcohol and tobacco licensing, Board of Review, election updates, human resource laws, leadership, and legislative updates. A partial scholarship was awarded from the Wisconsin Clerk's Education Fund to attend.
