# Voting in the Village of Jackson

## Voter Eligibility

To be eligible to vote in the Village of Jackson, you must be:

- United States citizen
- At least 18 years old on Election Day
- Resident of the Village of Jackson for 28 consecutive days before the election
- Finished serving any sentence, including probation/parole, if convicted of a felony

## Voter Registration

You can register to vote through [www.myvote.wi.gov](http://www.myvote.wi.gov), via mail, or in the Clerk's Office through the Friday before election.

On Election Day, you can register to vote at your polling location.

Acceptable proof of residency is needed to register to vote.

## Voting Absentee

You may vote absentee in the Clerk's Office beginning the 14th day before an election and ending at 5PM the Friday before an election. This can be done anytime during regular business hours.

Notice of in-person absentee voting dates and hours will be posted at the Jackson Municipal Complex, the Jackson Post Office, the Jackson Community Center, and on the Village website.

## Voting Absentee by Mail

You can request an absentee ballot through [www.myvotewi.gov](http://www.myvotewi.gov) or in writing to the clerk's office. Your absentee application must be mailed and contain:

- Your name
- Address where registered to vote
- Address where ballot should be sent
- Your signature
- Copy of your photo ID

Absentee ballots for the 2026 elections may be requested beginning January 1, 2026.

*It is a felony to vote at the polls if you have returned an absentee ballot!*

## Voter Photo ID

Wisconsin requires voters to show photo ID to vote. An acceptable photo ID is not required to include a current address.

## Misc. Information

If you move within 28 days of an election, you can only vote from your previous address, at your old polling location.

Voters with mobility issues may utilize curbside voting.
