**Note:** In determining construction cost, all costs for building and labor shall be included except costs associated with all Plumbing, Electrical, HVAC (incl. fireplaces), Landscape work.

<b>12 - 13 year olds:</b>	<b>The forfeiture amount is the deposit amount only (except for truancy violations)</b>			

Forfeitures for violations shall conform to forfeitures for violation of the comparable state offense, including any variations or increases for second offense as published in the State of Wisconsin Revised Deposit Schedules as adopted by the Wisconsin Judicial Conference, and any guidance issued by the Mid-Moraine Municipal Court.

The Police Chief is granted authority to establish bond/stipulation for any violations not listed in this document.

As soon as practicable, after such action, the Police Chief shall propose the necessary changes in this bond/stipulation schedule.
